

SCHOOL DISTRICT GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

It is the goal of the Board to provide each student opportunity to develop into an adult who can stand confidently, participate fully, learn continually, and contribute meaningfully to our world.

Four objectives which contribute to the achievement of these goals are to:

1. help individual learners develop the ability to think. To do this, we must provide continuous opportunity for learners to solve problems. In order to solve problems, learners must develop skills in order to analyze; to hypothesize, and to gather, evaluate, classify, and compare data.
2. help learners make life rewarding and satisfying. This requires knowledge of the cultural advantages of our society. Such knowledge would help ensure intelligent use of leisure time, intelligent use of community cultural resources, and intelligent use of natural resources.
3. provide learning experiences which will assist the learner to become a self-supporting member of society. These experiences should provide all learners with background against which they can make realistic vocational choices and an understanding of the responsibilities of all in employer-employee relationships.
4. provide learning experiences which foster characteristics needed to live in our democratic society:
 - A. develop basic skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening.
 - B. utilize basic mathematics skills in daily living.
 - C. acquire knowledge and understandings associated with the social and natural sciences.
 - D. apply the basic skills of learning, thinking, and use of the scientific approach to problem solving.
 - E. learn to be a good citizen and to understand and practice the democratic ideals of our nation.
 - F. develop positive attitudes towards self and others and be understanding and tolerant of fellow human beings.
 - G. develop good character, self-respect, and pride in personal accomplishments.
 - H. learn to understand and appreciate the aesthetic things in life.
 - I. gain information and skills necessary to enter the job market.
 - J. become a good manager of money, time, property, and resources.

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
